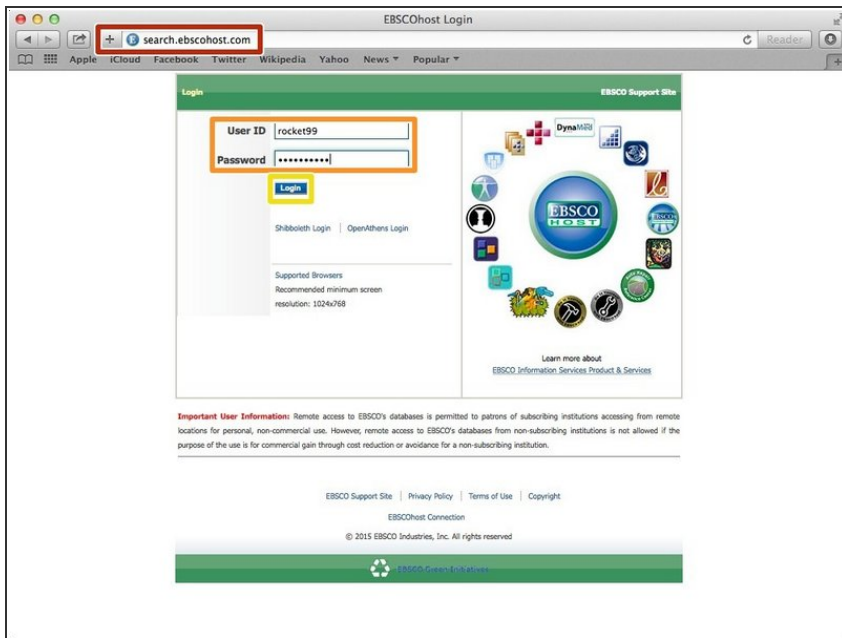

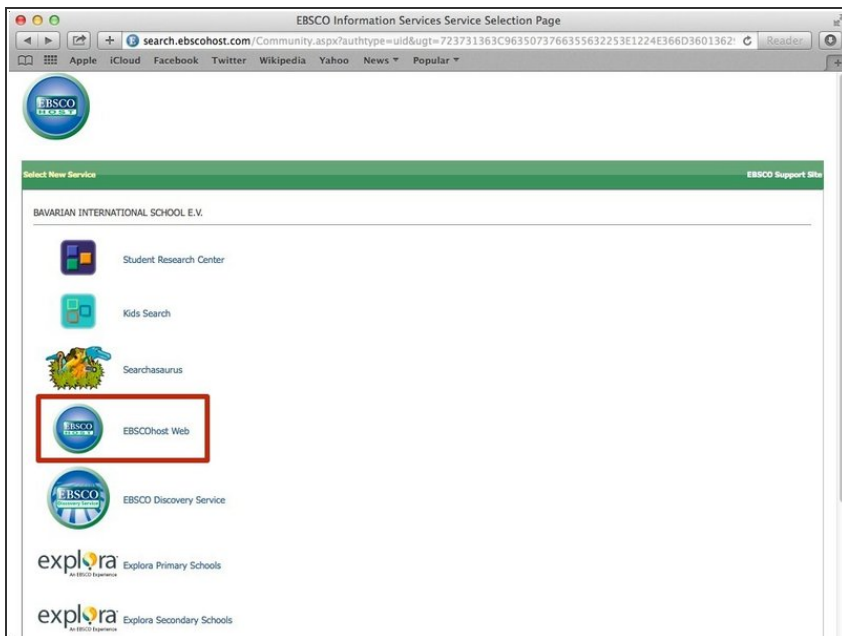

Step 1 — Finding The Website



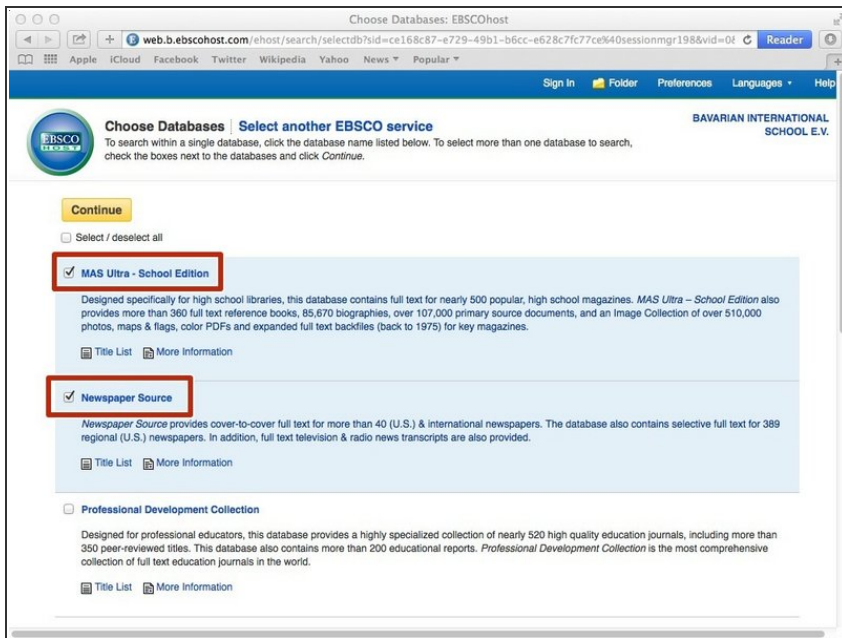
- Type the website address in the address bar
- Type in the username and password
- Click the blue "Login" button

Step 2 — Accessing EBSCOhost Web



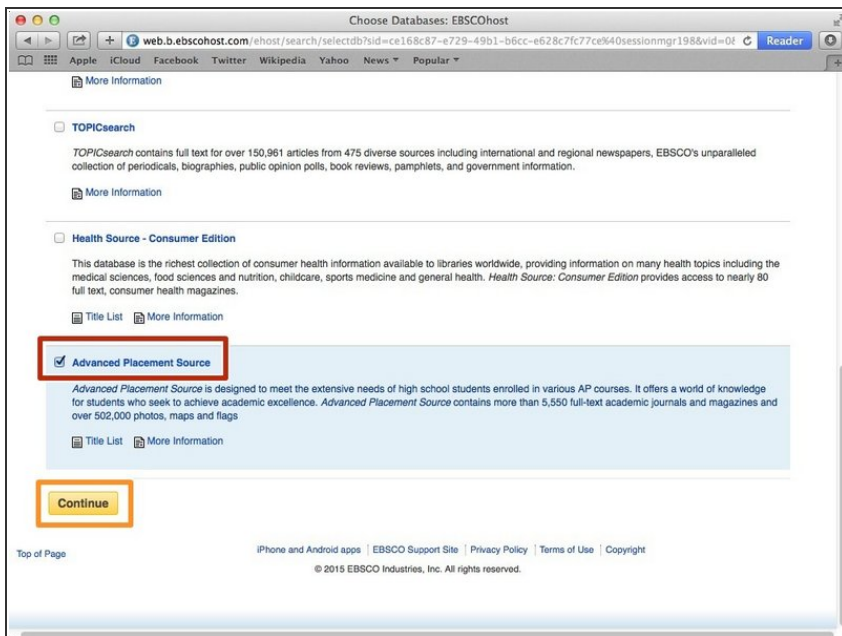
- Click on EBSCChost Web

Step 3 — EBSCOhost web



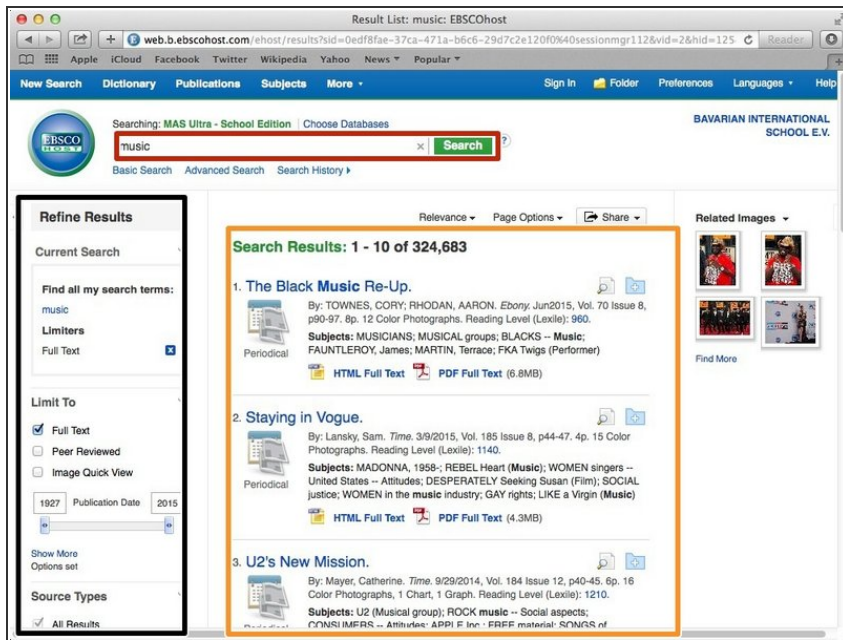
- Tick the selected boxes

Step 4 — EBSCOhost Web



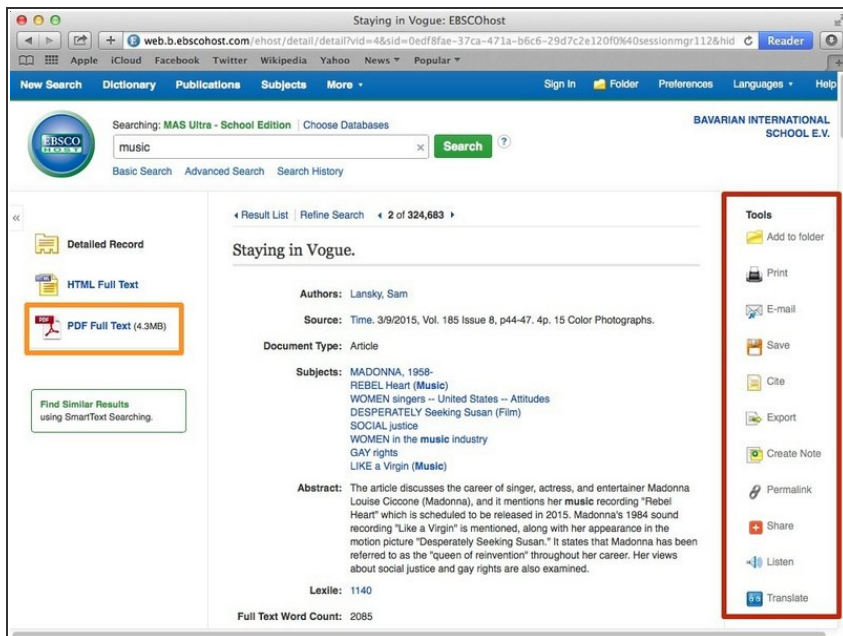
- Tick this last box
